Thursford (01328 878345), If you'd rather wash down your seafood with a barrel of booze and some rock sounds, head to Sweden, where every third week in August you can party with 1.6 million gourmets at Malmo's annual crayfish festival (www. malmo.se). A cracking good time...

Aesthetes, book flights to New York this minute - the city is prettier than ever in September. First, the newly-relocated Museum of Arts and Design opens its doors with a Second Lives exhibition: expect bottle caps and other everyday objects transformed into installations. Then, from September 21, at the Museum of Modern Art, Van Gogh and The Colors of the Night offers a more traditional culture fix, with moody images that span the artist's career. Lastly, Chanel's Mobile Art Pavillion (above) totters into town, displaying works inspired by the design house's 2 signature guilted bag - while giving you the excuse to buy one of Lagerfeld's dreamy pochettes.
